What Should I Give This Christmas?

Every year, one of the most common questions around Christmas is, "What should I give?" We want to give something that people will appreciate and enjoy. Other questions may be deciding what to give the person who has everything, or the harder question of how to pay for presents.

- What is a gift? It's something you give someone else without asking anything in return. Many may feel guilty after receiving a gift and give one in return. This isn't a requirement at all. It's not supposed to be a competition. Are they going to get me a good present? Who spent the most money? Who's gift is more thoughtful? These aren't the questions we should be asking as Christians. We should be asking, "Does this person I'm giving a gift to feel loved? Do they see Jesus in me?" When deciding what to get or do for someone, think how you can glorify Christ with your gift. Give a gift out of Christian love, with sincerity in your heart, and it will.
- What kind of gift did God give us? He gave us His only Son to provide us a way to heaven, and grace to pardon us. He gave us love we could never earn, grace, and eternal life through Jesus Christ. He gave us a perfect gift of love. What more could people ask for from Him? People ask for money, big houses, fancy things, power, fame or influence, because they'd rather have their reward now than in heaven. We as Christians are to live humble lives, putting God and others first, and we'll be rewarded forever for our faithfulness.
- What gift did Jesus give us? He left His throne in heaven to be born of a virgin, live a humble life of servitude to God the Father and to all those He encountered. He gave His very life and suffered inhumanely to do so, so that we might have life through Him. What more could anyone ask for? Why do people ask Him for more than what He already gave? Someone who willingly gave you their life has already given you everything you need.
- What kind of gift should I give? You don't need to spend money. You don't need to shop all day or browse catalogs or rack your brain looking for the perfect gift. We are to give love. Sounds simple, doesn't it? It can be. Look around you. What do people need? What would Jesus give them? Not only did Jesus perform miracles, but He provided acts of service to others that most might humiliating to perform. He washed other's feet. He fed crowds of hungry people. He visited the sick, and listened to people who really needed someone to talk to. Follow His example.

When I consider how much money to spend at Christmas, I remember the story of "The Little Drummer Boy." In this classic story, a young boy gets to meet baby Jesus. He wants to bring Him a gift to show his respect, but has nothing but his drum. So, what did he do? He played his drum as best He could for baby Jesus. He gave of his talent, and this is the kind of gift we can all give. Are you like me, and short on talent? Give the gift of time, attention, or a phone call. Serve others without asking for anything in return. Write a letter to someone you haven't seen in a while. Be there for someone. Use your skills to create something – a poem, a story, a card, a picture or other work of art. Maybe you need to offer forgiveness you've withheld. It could be as simple as a prayer for someone who doesn't even know you're

thinking of them. Let people know you love them. Be courteous and respectful, and not just at Christmas. Reach out to others in the way God enables you, especially ones who

may be lonely or depressed. The Christmas season is hard on many people who aren't in contact with family or loved ones, too. Look for a need, and fill it in a loving way. The wrapping doesn't need to be fancy, either. You don't need to top it with a bow. God's gift was wrapped tightly in swaddling clothes. We all have different abilities, personalities and even spiritual gifts. Use them to show love, and help to show what the first Christmas was really all about.

Not everyone is expecting a gift from you. Surprise them. Wouldn't it warm your heart to get a gift completely out of the blue? It could be a complement from someone you didn't know had ever noticed you. Being told by someone I barely knew that they could tell I was a Christian was one of the greatest gifts I ever got, and it wasn't even Christmas! If you receive a gift, it doesn't mean you have to pay them back, either. Enjoy it. Appreciate it, and tell them you do. It's good to be shown love, too, and it can rekindle a tired soul. Everyone reacts to receiving a gift in different ways. Don't be offended if someone seems awkward receiving a gift. Maybe they might even be suspicious. Why did you give me this? Why would you do something so thoughtful for me? Place their concerns to rest by showing them love consistently throughout the year. How many times have we all seen a child open a new toy, only to spend the next two hours playing with the box and the paper, instead. They feel loved, even if they don't know what to do with your gift. Even as adults, we may not know how to react, but the important thing is that the love of God is shared with them. This world is consumed with buying and getting stuff, but we should see through that. Warm a heart or make someone smile. What makes you feel loved? Get to know someone, and you can learn what makes them feel the love of God. This is a great witnessing tool, and should always be the first step in sharing the gospel with them. What better gift could you give than leading someone to Jesus?

Philippians 2:3-5 tells us what mindset we should live in. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interest, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus. This is only a guideline, and how we give the gift of love to others should come from our hearts and be guided by the Holy Spirit. Celebrate this Christmas by passing on the love, mercy and grace God gave us first. Give from the heart. Give the gift of love.

Pattern your gift ideas after God's example. His gift is eternal life, offered freely. Jesus gave us the gift of his life so we could save ours forever. That gift can't be bought with cash, credit, good looks, or works. Don't give expecting something in return. A gift isn't a trade, but is offered without strings or demands. You need only accept it. If you haven't already, will you receive the gift of life provided by God out of love? Jesus already paid for the gift. All you have to do is open your heart and trust in Him.

The Law Of The LORD Is Perfect

You may or may not know, but I have finally left Death Row after nearly eleven years. That time, combined with almost four years pretrial, has all been spent in solitary confinement. The damage to my mind and body from such an extended period in solitary may never be fully assessed but I am afraid it is more extensive than I realize. It is such a slow process of breakdown that most people can't see it happening. While I knew I was getting quirky in some ways, I always thought my mind escaped the solitary ordeal.

Mississippi State Penitentiary has a policy that forces men coming off of Death Row to transition through a lock-down building on the way to General Population regardless of the prisoners past behavior or accomplishments. I have known about this policy and have thought that it is unfair at best. Spending a year in lockdown after so many on Death Row seemed like a parting shot by the State. A stupid policy for sure.

Once I got to this transition building I can't tell you how thankful for this policy I became. There are so many people moving around without chains on, so much noise and so many different conversations, and the building is essentially prisoner ran, that my brain was screaming, "DANGER! DANGER! DANGER!" Every person was a threat, every sound triggering the fight or flight response, and with nowhere to go everything felt like it had to be handled with extreme fight for my life violence.

I am self aware enough to know that I wasn't in any danger and that every sound I heard wasn't the prelude to an attack. I couldn't do anything to get my mind to relax and process the truth of what was really going on. I had been in solitary confinement so long that the change was debilitating. I am great now but that first week was the most anxious, frightened, and potentially violent I have ever been. Had I been given what I though I deserved and immediately transferred from Death Row to General Population something bad would have happened to me. I honestly believe that I would have had a complete mental break. Because I am too full of Gods Spirit to act out aggressively the pressure would have been released in some way. Pop! Goes the mind.

This has me thinking about God's word. How many of His commandments and decrees did the Israelites understand? Do this, don't do that; Eat this – not that, wash your stuff this way, burn it in that way Jesus has given us our share of commandments to follow and through Paul, many more. We may not understand them, or in this day and age even agree with them, but we must obey them anyway because they are for out good.

The blessings and curses Moses lays out in Deuteronomy 28 and the choice of life and death in Deut 30:11-20 are just as relevant today as they were when they were spoken. Our hope is in the Lord and in His Word. If we pick and choose what to obey and what we disobey because we don't understand it, disagree with it, or think it isn't "modern", then we are in for a lot of trouble. Life and death, peace and anxiety.

As we prepare for Christmas and the New Year join me in committing to living Biblically. Search out the areas in your life that don't align with the Word and make the corrections. God doesn't give us suggestions on how to live the best life. He commands us to follow His Word for His glory in our living the best life.

I leave you with one of the greatest Psalms. Have a glorious year in Jesus.

Psalm 19

1 The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. 2 Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge. 3 There is no speech, nor are there words. whose voice is not heard. 4 Their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world. In them he has set a tent for the sun. 5 which comes out like a bridegroom leaving his chamber, and, like a strong man, runs its course with joy. 6 Its rising is from the end of the heavens. and its circuit to the end of them, and there is nothing hidden from its heat. 7 The law of the Lord is perfect. reviving the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure. making wise the simple; 8 the precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the Lord is pure. enlightening the eyes; 9 the fear of the Lord is clean. enduring forever; the rules of the Lord are true, and righteous altogether. 10 More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb. 11 Moreover, by them is your servant warned; in keeping them there is great reward. 12 Who can discern his errors?
